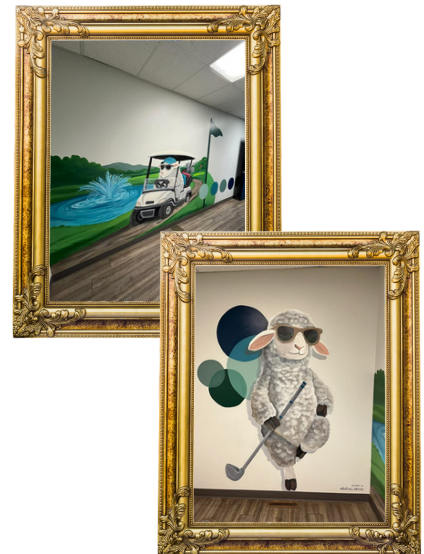

Course Update 🏌️

June was officially the wettest June in recorded history for the Edmonton region, bringing enormous challenges to the golf course. Over a 10-day period, we received 174 mm of rainfall, which resulted in significant flooding throughout the property. Fortunately, only two greens were directly affected: #1 and #4. To help mitigate the effects of excessive moisture, one of the most effective practices is solid-tine aeration. This process vents the greens, allowing oxygen to enter the soil profile and helping the surfaces dry more quickly. It also promotes healthier root growth and aids recovery from the stress caused by saturated conditions. The fairways and rough experienced even greater volumes of water. Fortunately, the floodwater carried very little silt, which means cleanup requirements are minimal. In some areas, verticutting may still be necessary to clean up turf surfaces affected by standing water and restore playing conditions. One of the major advantages of our golf course is its sand-based soil profile. This allows for excellent drainage and means the long-term effects of the excessive rainfall should be minimal. While the recent weather has certainly presented challenges, the course has responded remarkably well, and we expect conditions to continue improving as we move into the summer months.

President's Message to Our Golfers

Dear Golfers,

The past ten days have reminded us—rather forcefully—that Mother Nature always has the final say. Our region has seen significant rainfall, and the weekend of June 20 brought enough water to push Ross Creek well beyond its banks. Holes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, and 9 all experienced flooding, with water reaching greens 1 and 4 and covering large portions of several fairways for days. By mid-week, we were finally seeing encouraging signs. The creek began to recede, the standing water started to pull back, and early assessments showed minimal damage aside from a couple of bridges. We were optimistic.

Unfortunately, Mother Nature decided to give us a second test this weekend. Heavy rainfall returned, and once again the creek breached the banks on holes 1, 2, 3, 6, and partially 4 and 9. Today, we still have standing water across multiple fairways, and we now need sunshine—and a little luck—to help the creek recede so our team can get back out there and fully assess the impact.

I do want to highlight the tremendous work happening behind the scenes. Mid-week, when the course was empty, Jerry and his crew took advantage of the downtime to treat greens and tee boxes so they'll be ready for us the moment we can return. They'll continue that work this week to keep the course in the best possible condition. Adam has been out on the grounds looking for every possible way to get us back to the game we all love. Fort in View has generously lent us pumps to help move the standing water once the creek drops enough for us to safely use them. As soon as conditions allow, we'll put them to work.

Our team is doing everything within their control to get us back out there. What we need now is cooperation from the weather. I want to personally thank Adam and Jerry for their dedication, quick action, and steady leadership during this challenging stretch. I have full confidence they'll get us playing again as soon as it's safe and feasible.

Let's continue to support our course and our staff as they navigate this difficult period. We'll keep you updated as conditions improve.
